President's Message

I hope this letter finds everyone preparing to have a happy holiday season with friends and relatives. This is a perfect opportunity to stop and reflect on the past year's accomplishments and set goals for the upcoming year.

As a Chapter, I was glad to see a great showing (107 students and professionals) at our 2004 Annual Meeting. We all agree that supporting student opportunities to develop into tomorrow's professionals is an important goal of our Chapter. We passed a motion to pay travel and hotel expenses for Hutton students to attend our annual meeting. We continued to encourage subunit presidents to participate in our excom by paying for travel to excom meetings and a portion of parent society dues. I am glad to report that each subunit was represented at each of the excom meetings this year. Environmental affairs have been very quiet this year. I hope that this is good news on the environmental front, although probably short-lived. Remember, it is important that you remain vigilant on environmental issues and forward any information to your officers.

Joe Stoeckel has been organizing a joint meeting between our Chapter, the Wildlife Society, Forest Service, and Arkansas Association of Foresters. We expect 200+ people at the meeting. We are planning several presentations from the Ouachita and Ozark-St. Francis Forests followed by a panel discussion. This will be a great time for us to provide input on the revisions to the Forest Plan and meet other professionals in the state. I hope that the great agenda Joe is planning will draw in old and new members so that we can reverse the decline in professional membership. Additional

information on the meeting is included in the newsletter and on the web.

The excom recently discussed the possibility of collecting and preserving records and oral histories of the Chapter and members at the University of Central Arkansas Library Special Collections department in Conway. The Arkansas Chapter of The Wildlife Society has chosen this site to preserve their records because they already have a strong Arkansas environmental history focus. The library has in their possession the records of the Arkansas Ecology Center, Arkansas Conservation Coalition, Carl Hunter papers, and the Carol Griffie papers. The type of records that we might consider housing in the library would be meeting minutes, abstracts, newsletters, resolutions, officer lists with short biographies, treasurer reports, photographs, general correspondence, etc. I will be investigating this opportunity further between now and our annual meeting.

Dr. Alan Christian, the new fisheries professor at Arkansas State University, has expressed an interest in forming a student subunit in Jonesboro. He believes that they would probably have 10 students at first that would be interested in the subunit. This will be a great opportunity for our Chapter and the ASU students. I will be working with Dr. Christian in the coming months to prepare bylaws and seek official recognition as a subunit from the Parent Society. I look forward to visiting with everyone at the annual meeting in February.

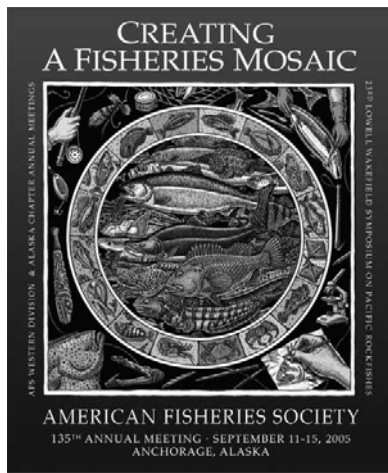

EXCOM Meeting Summary December 2, 2004

An AR AFS EXCOM meeting was held on December 2, 2004 at Arkansas Tech University in Russellville. The meeting was attended by the following in the order in which they signed the attendance sheet:

Initially, before the meeting actually began, the group entered into an intense discussion about what kind of wine should be provided at the social in the up-coming meeting. Someone suggested getting a local wine to which Steve Lochmann denounced all Arkansas wines and suggested several other options, being an apparent connoisseur. John Jackson suggested that since we were getting Busch beer in kegs, that a Busch equivalent wine would be fine which would include Arkansas wines. Lochmann continued his assault with witty comments about Arkansas wines such as calling Wiederkehr, "weed-killer", etc.

The President, Chris Davidson officially began the meeting. The first order of business consisted of an overall agreement that there was no need to approve the minutes from the last EXCOM meeting since a summary of the minutes was already published in the last newsletter.

Treasurer Mike Bivin gave the treasurer report and provided a handout of the status of the chapter funds. The handout showed income and

expenditures account balance was \$15,383 at that time. Bivin pointed out that the account fluctuates over time and provided a history of final calendar year account balances. The balances ranged from a low of \$10,900 to high of \$15,945 among the years from 1998 to 2004. Bivin pointed out that the chapter is not currently doing anything that makes money; therefore, we should be cautious with new expenditures.

Lochmann asked if the new funding for dues and travel for Student Chapter officers was having much of an impact on Chapter finances. Referring to the handout, Bivin showed that disbursements for Subunit memberships and travel reimbursements totaled only \$247.80.

The group then discussed how money would be spent on Hutton students travel to meetings in the future. Bowman looked up the minutes from the 2004 business meeting and read the approved motion stating that \$150 would be paid to Hutton students for travel to the business meeting "next year".

Davidson then continued the meeting into "Old Business" and asked for an update on the research Bivin has been conducting concerning the Chapter's ability to participate in litigation based on our tax-exempt status. Bivin gave details of several people he had contacted and gathered information from, including various lawyers, past SDAFS President Steve Filipek, and current President Larry Conner, and AFS legal folks. Bivin was waiting for a call back from AFS, and had otherwise reached no conclusions or a definitive answer. Lochmann recommended that Bivin contact Pete frost with Western Legal whom AR AFS and other non-profit groups retained in a lawsuit dealing with Bear Creek. Lochmann was tasked with getting Pete Frost's contact information to Bivin. Bivin will continue to research the situation with Pete Frost and AFS.

Continuing "Old Business" Davidson reminded the group that the Chapter had passed a resolution in support of the Wallup-Breaux reauthorization at the 2004 business meeting. He then proceeded to read a recent e-mail update

from Larry Rider on the matter. The current authorization has been again extended for eight months from September 30, 2004.

Davidson moved the meeting on to “Committee Reports” from committees that were represented. Stoeckel reported for the Awards and Nominations Committee. He said that he had received 2 nominations for each of the awards that the Chapter gives out each year. There was then some discussion and coordination about the plaques for this year’s meeting. No other committees were represented.

Davidson moved on to a discussion about the newsletter. Lochmann asked that everyone submit stuff to Liz Heitman ASAP, but added that the newsletter would still not go out until next year. Heitman then read a list of things that she understood needed to be included in the next newsletter to which the group agreed. Davidson asked for the meeting registration form for the up-coming annual meeting, to be included in the newsletter. Bivin asked that we create a box on the form to indicate exactly what year the dues are being paid for. Davidson will send last year’s form to Stoeckel to modify, who in turn will send to Bivin to modify, who will then in turn send to Heitman for the newsletter. Then a discussion was had by the group about getting people to pre-register to save some registration work (for Bivin) at the meeting. Many ideas for incentives to do so were discussed.

The discussion then conveniently drifted into the “new business” of planning the up-coming annual meeting. The next topic of discussion was the registration fee. Lochmann suggested that it go up to at least \$45. Information was exchanged about the last few meetings. The registration fee for the last meeting was \$30 and the Chapter made \$220, but that was because we had many donations, which were shown on Bivin’s balance sheet. The LA and TN joint Chapter meetings lost money. A great deal more discussion continued and the point was made that the goal of charging a meeting registration was to cover the costs of the meeting. At that point, Joe was asked to calculate the costs of the meeting, which Joe proceeded to do with help

from the group (the Secretary will now spare you the details of those calculations as it makes for even more boring reading than the minutes are already).

Once again, as part of the calculations, the subject of alcohol came up and a debate began about how many kegs would be needed for the social. Gagen immediately exclaimed that we should plan for 30 people to a keg. With a few more calculations and some historic figures reviewed from past meetings, it was verified that indeed, it comes to about 30 people per keg and the appropriate number was determined.

The discussion got back to the registration fees and the group began debating whether students should be charged a lesser fee than professionals should. Fubar remained strangely quiet during this discussion but the ATU subunit members indicated that they did not mind paying the same as professionals but did say they \$30 to \$40 seemed appropriate. Bowman then added that with \$15 K in the bank we should not be all that worried about completely covering meeting costs and driving registration fees higher and higher every meeting. Bowman dated himself by reminiscing about when Chapter meetings cost only \$10 for registration, but continued to try to make the point that Chapter meetings should be more casual, less expensive, and more enjoyable than larger meetings and the registration fees should reflect that. Bowman finished by suggesting that students be charged considerably less than professionals are in order to promote student participation. Again, more adding and division took place and finally the group agreed to registration fees of \$45 for professionals and \$30 for students.

The group then discussed how profits / losses would be shared with the two other groups involved with this joint meeting (Wildlife Society – now there’s a good name for a group; and the Ouachita Chapter of the Society of American Forestry). Lochmann suggested and the group agreed that the gains / losses be shared on a per capita basis with the two other groups.

Stoeckel clarified that the mixer (social) would be held at the State Park and the dinner would be held at the Yell County Wildlife Federation Building. Stoeckel stated that we were planning to hire AR AFS Chapter member Kent Coffey's bluegrass band to provide entertainment at the mixer. Bowman corrected that although Kent has a bluegrass band and a jazz band, we were planning on Kent's blues band, "The Heaters". The group discussed Kent's request for \$100 payment to four of the six band members because Kent and his wife, Becky will donate their performance. Kent had also requested that hotel rooms for the band members be provided because they have to travel from the Yellville area and the \$100 fee will be lost on a room and food if rooms are not provided. The group discussed the matter and agreed that if we wanted quality entertainment from real musicians that make their living playing music, than we should be willing to pay for it and support it. The group agreed to the requests and Stoeckel said he would handle the room reservations for the band.

The group discussed where to have a block of rooms reserved. Information about the local hotels was exchanged and the group agreed that Stoeckel would handle that also.

The group discussed other needs for the meeting. Stoeckel will arrange for parking so that attendees will not receive parking citations. The group discussed the need for a map of the meeting location needs to be included in the newsletter, and that a map of the area needs to be provided at registration. Stoeckel asked if the group desired to set up some field trips as part of the meeting and group rapidly concluded that we did not want to go there.

The group then discussed the timing of the various parts of the meeting including the special session on the US Forest plans, the business meeting, and the technical sessions. It was agreed that the forest plan would be Wednesday afternoon, the technical sessions would run all day Thursday until time for the business meeting, which would begin at 3:00pm. The group concluded meeting planning by discussing

the need to provide transportation to the mixer. Bowman argued that this was necessary, but the group disagreed and decided that folks were on their own to get there and back. (The Secretary still disagrees with this decision and requests that someone allow him to ride with them to the mixer)

The group continued into other "New Business". Davidson advised that there was interest in creating a subunit at ASU. Lochmann explained the process that should be followed and suggested that ASU be provided the UAF Subunit bylaws as a guide. Once ASU creates bylaws for their subunit, ASU gives them to the AR Chapter EXCOM. Once the EXCOM approves, we send to AFS for approval by their EXCOM.

Davidson began a new topic by reading an e-mail from Blake Sassy explaining how the Wildlife Society has begun an effort to preserve chapter records, history, and oral histories of members as historical reference documents and archives. This is being done with the University of Central Arkansas. The group discussed our interest in beginning a similar endeavor. The group discussed the benefits and need for such information to be archived and agreed to pursue it. Davidson will contact the UCA Library to get started.

Meeting adjourned to the delight of all participants since almost all work discussed fell on Joe Stoeckel!

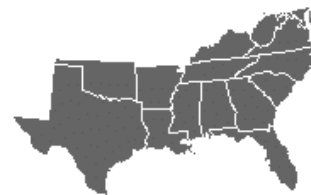
organization and set up, and also presented posters on their current research

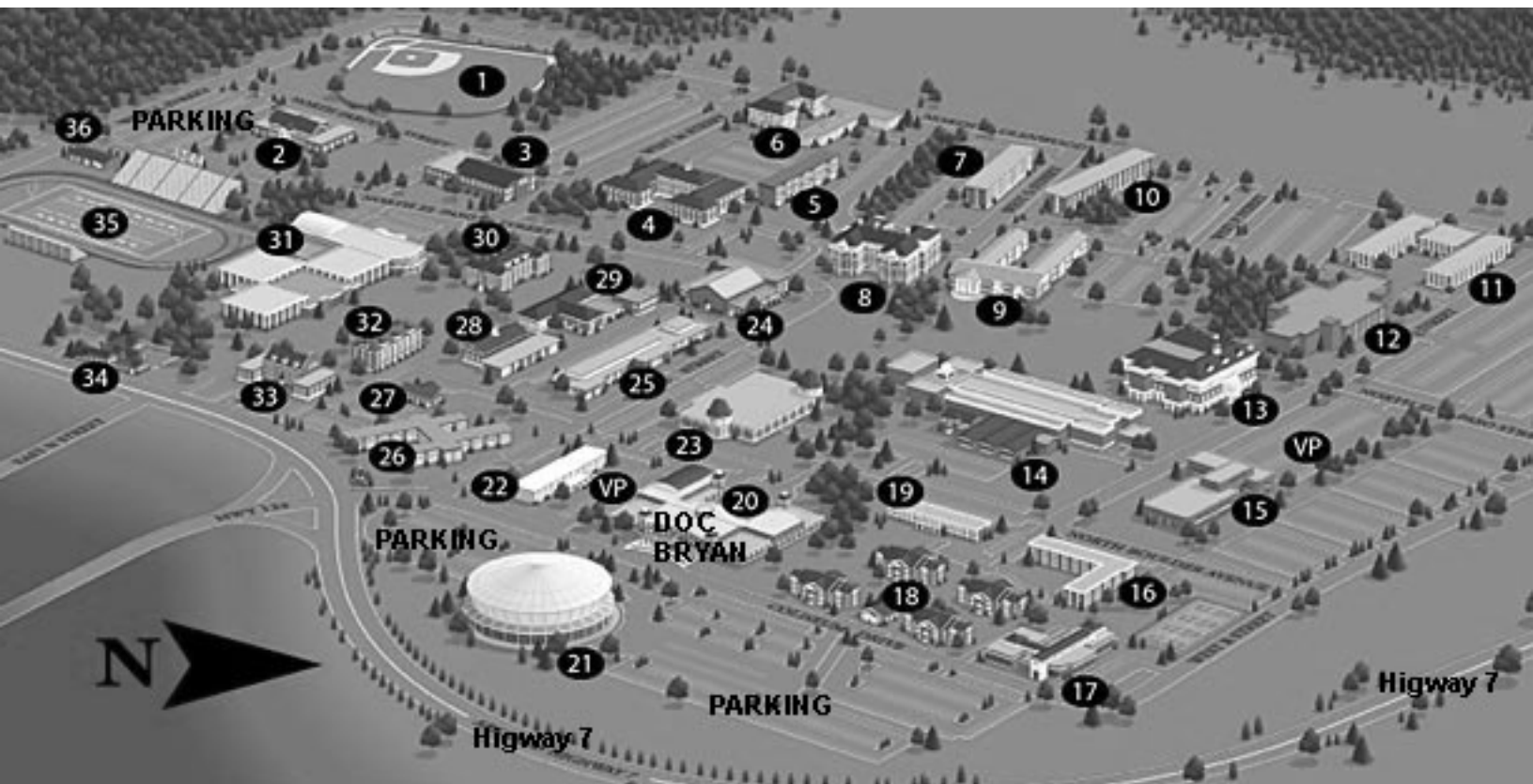

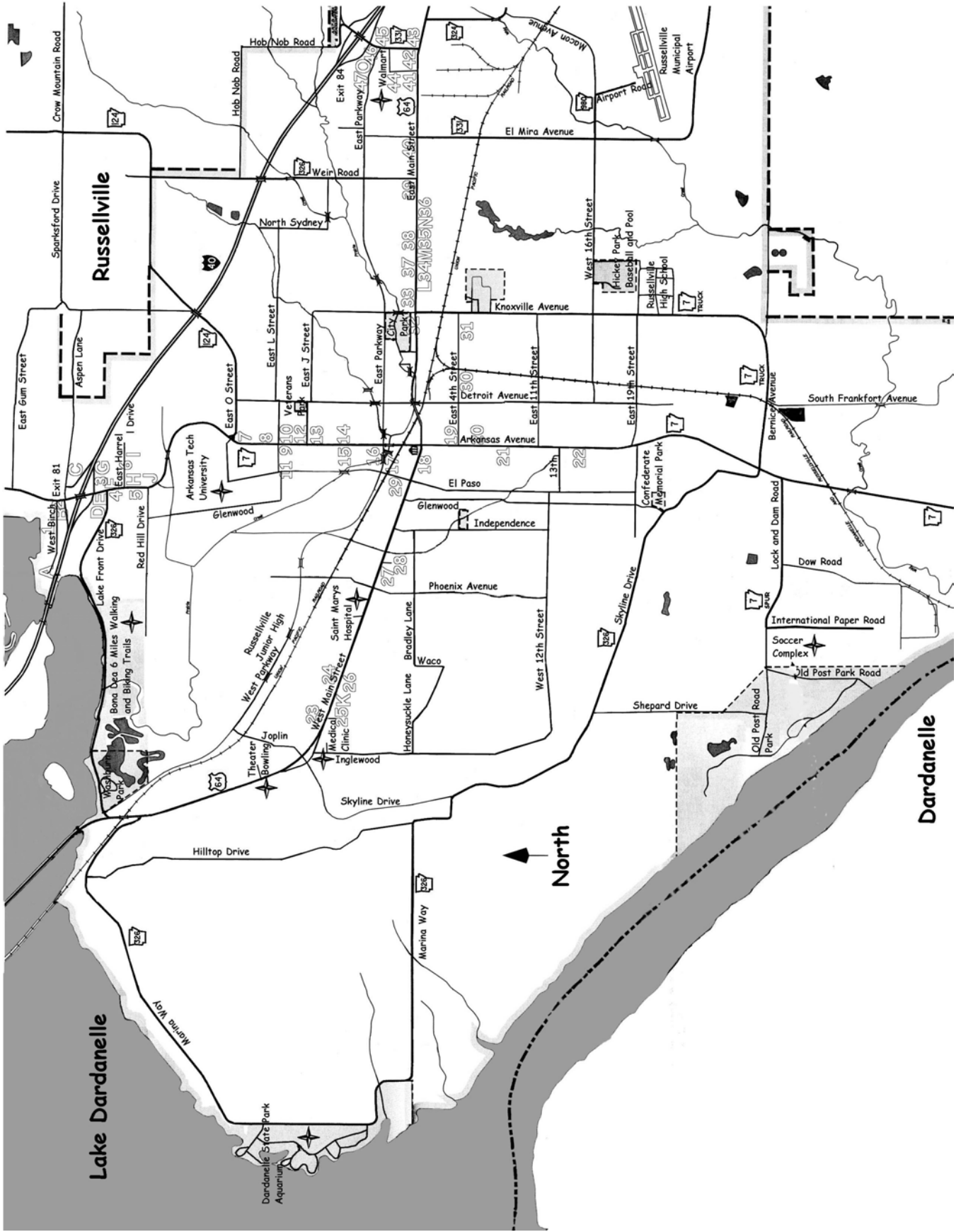
